

## Make your own Easter card

In the Cathedral you will find a lot of beautiful stained glass windows.



You can also find a painting showing the story of St Edmund by Brian Whelan. As well as paint, Brian uses pieces of silver foil and sweet wrappers to create his pictures.




## You will need:

2 pieces of card (if possible 1 white and 1 black), sweet wrappers or pieces of foil, scissors, glue

Fold the white piece of card in half to form your greetings card. Decide if you want the fold at the side or at the top.

Take the black piece of card and cut it so that it is slightly smaller than the 'front' of your greetings card.

Mark out a design on the black card so that you create a 'window'. Cut out the 'holes'.



Here is an example of what your design might look like.

Now use your sweet wrappers or pieces of foil to cover the holes. You may need to overlap one or two wrappers to cover each hole.

Glue them in place.

Turn over the design, so that the 'rough' side with the glue is on the reverse.

Stick the black card onto the front of the white card.

Add your Easter greeting.
