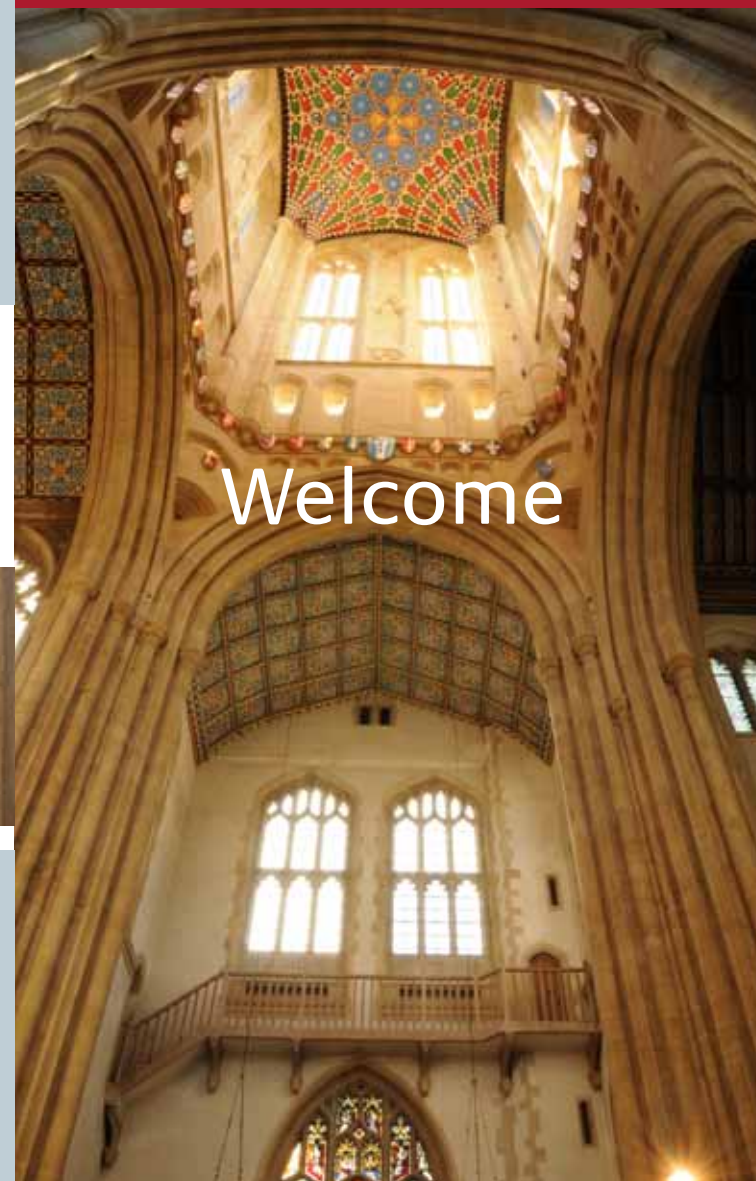

## Welcome to Suffolk's Cathedral

We offer all who come here a warm welcome, space to pray and the chance to explore the fine architecture and history of this building.

- 1 The elegant NAVE** of the church was built by John Wastell in 1503. Guided tours of the Cathedral are available May to September. See website for more details.



- 2 The LEGO® model** We are recreating St Edmundsbury Cathedral out of 200,000 LEGO® bricks. We are one of only four cathedrals in the country to be doing a LEGO® Cathedral project (Exeter, Durham and Chester are the others). For a donation of £1 you can place a brick on our model.



- 3 The SUSANNA WINDOW** tells the story of Susanna and the Elders from the Apocrypha. This is the oldest glass in the Cathedral, dated at around 1480.

- 4 The MILLENNIUM TOWER** is a striking lantern tower, built of Barnack limestone, flint and lime mortar. It is the crowning glory of St Edmundsbury Cathedral and was completed in 2005.

The tower is 160ft high and there are 202 steps to the top which gives you amazing views from the highest public access point in the town.

Tower tours run from Easter to October. For prices and bookings check our website.

- 5 The Lady Chapel** This chapel is set aside for quiet prayer and reflection. Pilgrims come daily to light candles and leave their prayers here.



- 6 The Quire and Altar** Housing the Bishop's Throne (Cathedra) makes this church the Cathedral of the Diocese of St Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

- 7 The Chapels dedicated to St Edmund and the Transfiguration** Works of art include the Frink Crucifixion and the Sybil Andrews tapestry of the Martyrdom of St Edmund.



- 8 The Treasury** was opened in 2011 and displays church plates, ancient books and the Bury Cross plus changing exhibitions.

- 9 The Cathedral Centre** includes Pilgrims' Kitchen Café (see overleaf for details) and our Discovery Centre working with schools and young people.
