Abbot Baldwin became Abbot of Bury St Edmunds in 1065. In 1095 he had constructed a magnificent new shrine for the remains of St Edmund. Here, Henry VI is seen visiting the shrine which was destroyed in the dissolution of the monasteries.

St Edmund, or Edmund the Martyr, was an East Anglian king killed by the Danish heathen army in 869. Some sources say he died in battle; others that he was shot with arrows when he refused to renounce Christ. Until the fourteenth century, he was regarded as the patron saint of England alongside Edward the Confessor.
