The Feast of the Epiphany

The season of joyful celebration that began at Christmas continues today with the Feast of the Epiphany. Epiphany means 'manifestation' and so, as we recall the visit of the far-travelled magi to Jesus, we celebrate his birth and his love being made known to the Gentiles. Although the account of their visit in Matthew's Gospel simply speaks of 'wise men from the east', later tradition fixed their number at three, made them kings, and recalled their resonant names—Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar.

The Gospel Book is carried in procession to the centre of the Nave and the people turn towards it.



The sermon is followed by a short period of quiet for reflection.

The Creed

All We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

> We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven. was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

If you wish you receive prayers for healing, and anointing, please go to the Lady Chapel after receiving Communion.

During the distribution of communion, the choir may sing a motet.
